Reflection on the Sunday of the Man Born Blind

"I was blind, and now I see." (John 9:25)

This Sunday, the sixth and final before the Feast of the Ascension, brings us to the story of the Man Born Blind, a powerful testimony to the healing and revealing work of Christ in our lives.

In the Gospel, Christ gives sight to a man who had never seen light—someone not just physically blind, but excluded and forgotten. Yet Jesus sees him, touches the dust of the earth, and brings forth light from darkness. This miracle is more than physical—it is a sign of spiritual awakening.

The Church Fathers remind us that this man represents all of humanity—born into the blindness of sin, yet called to the light of faith through Christ. His healing shows us that faith is not merely about seeing with our eyes, but about recognizing the presence of God in our lives and confessing Him, like the man did: "Lord, I believe." (John 9:38)

Let us reflect today: Where am I still blind to God's grace? Where is Christ inviting me to see with the eyes of faith?

May we, like the man in the Gospel, allow Christ to open our hearts and lead us from darkness into light.

Quotes on the Sunday of the Man Born Blind

1. "One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."

The healed man testifies to the transforming power of Christ, offering a simple yet profound witness of faith. (John 9:25)

2. "The miracle was not only that he received sight, but that he received it from clay—what was lacking in nature, grace supplied." *St. John Chrysostom*

This reminds us that Christ re-creates us, just as He formed Adam from the dust, giving us a new beginning.

3. "Blinded in the eyes of my soul, I come to You, O Christ, as did the man blind from birth, and I cry out to You with repentance: You are the radiant Light of those in darkness." *Kontakion of the Feast (Tone 4)*

This hymn captures the heart of our prayer on this Sunday—longing for spiritual sight.
